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Brief Summary and Statement of Need:

Wildlife Conservation has professional biologists and technicians in 23 locations statewide performing field research and management of wildlife species. They have a continuing need for reliable, efficient and safe transportation equipment. Unreliable equipment jeopardizes the ability of staff to survey wildlife populations, manage hunts, and serve the public. Equipment that becomes unsafe puts field staff at risk of personal injury. Periodic equipment replacement is vital to staff performing science-based wildlife management activities. Examples of equipment to be purchased include: snow machines, all-terrain vehicles, skiffs and motors, aircraft engines, and storage sheds.

Appropriations for equipment of \$100.0 each from the Fish & Game Fund were authorized by CH61 FSSLA 2001, pg 18, ln 19; CH 1, SSSLA 2002, pg 38, ln 29; CH 82, SLA 2003, pg26, ln 31; Appropriation for \$200.0 from Federal and Fish & Game Fund, CH 159, SLA 2004, pg 25, ln 10

Project Description/Justification:

This appropriation will provide funding to purchase large transportation and scientific equipment for field staff. Field research and management staff need access to large areas of land and water and must use motorized vehicles, all-terrain vehicles, snowmachines, and boats. Technological equipment is also necessary to help staff communicate in the field and to enhance computer applications including GPS. Scientific equipment for analytical testing and specimen storage is needed by the Moose Research Center (located near Kenai) and by the Division's Wildlife Veterinarian.
